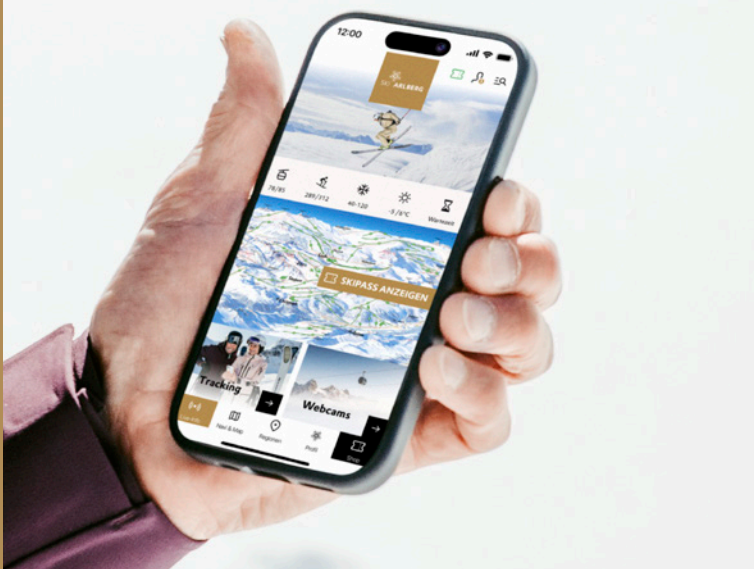

The **RUN of FAME** spans 85 kilometres and 18,000 metres of elevation, making it the **longest continuous ski circuit in the Alps**. It winds over the Arlberg, Flexen and Hochtannberg passes, dedicated to the pioneers and stars who left their mark on Arlberg.

At the heart of the RUN of FAME lies the **HALL of FAME**, where skiing history comes alive. One highlight is an **interactive pursuit called the HUNT of FAME**.

Toboggan runs

With thrilling natural toboggan runs, evening sledging through snow-draped forests and much more, the toboggan runs at Arlberg deliver lively fun for the whole family and a perfect complement to skiing and snowboarding.

Toboggan runs: **St. Anton:** a 4.2 km illuminated natural toboggan run to Nasserein, open daily from 12 noon to 4.15 pm. **Tip:** Fun and excitement plus a hearty stopover every Tuesday and Thursday during the tobogganing evening from Gampen down to the valley. • **Oberlech-Lech:** a 1.2 km illuminated and snow-covered toboggan run from Oberlech to Lech, open daily from 9 am to 9 pm. Bobsleighs available for hire at the Bergbahn Oberlech cable car. • **Warth:** toboggan run at Dorfbahn. Toboggan rental at the valley station. Weekly evening tobogganing as per notices and website.

For those looking to combine sporty activities with pure enjoyment in summer, Arlberg is the perfect destination. Countless hiking trails, crystal-clear mountain lakes and exquisite cuisine invite you to linger – as do swimming pools and golf courses in stunning locations. A special highlight in summer is the **Arlberg Trail**, spanning 43 kilometres with over 6,000 metres of elevation. Over three days, it winds through three stages across the five distinctive villages of Lech, Zürs, Stuben, St. Anton and St. Christoph. Thanks to the cable cars, the route is comfortably manageable – leaving plenty of time for tranquil mountain moments, breathtaking panoramas and delightful culinary experiences along the trail.

Local and ski bus

Ski buses in St. Anton/St. Jakob, as well as in Pettneu, Schnann and Flirsch, are marked with line numbers. In Lech and Zürs, blue local buses operate. These buses, along with the Warth-Schröcken ski bus (between Schröcken-Unterboden and Warth-Lechleiten) and the Lechtal ski bus, are free to use with a valid ski ticket for the purpose of alpine skiing.

Please note: Yellow Postbus buses between St. Anton/St. Christoph (free for part of the route) and Lech Zürs are subject to a fee.

Sonnenkopf: A free ski bus runs several times daily from Stuben am Arlberg to the Sonnenkopf cable car valley station and back.

Safety on the slopes

The safety of all winter sports enthusiasts is the top priority. Everyone should therefore be familiar with the key piste rules (FIS rules). In addition, boards with the heading **Check Your Risk** offer important information on avalanche danger, safety tips, and avalanche transceiver checkpoint.

Ski runs are marked and prepared if possible; they are checked and secured against atypical alpine dangers, especially avalanches.

Ski routes are marked and only secured against the risk of avalanches; they are generally not prepared or checked, or only in some cases.

Warning lights:

Yellow: Outside the safeguarded ski runs there is the risk of avalanches.
Level 4 (= HIGH) or Level 5 (= VERY HIGH)

For information on the current slope conditions refer to the panoramic boards at the cable car stations.
Flashing green or orange: Warning – queues! (Ski Arlberg app and www.skiarberg.at – always orange)
Ski run and ski route signs:

= closed = open

Slope closures and avalanche blasting: It is forbidden and a chargeable offence to enter closed ski runs and ski routes. It is not permitted, without exception, to enter forested areas and walk or sledge on ski runs. From the last checking run, immediately after the last ascent, ski runs and ski routes are closed due to the danger from slope maintenance vehicles and cable winches. Please note: No safety cordons! When there is a risk of avalanches, never use closed runs. In order to safeguard their own safety, people on tours outside the safeguarded and open ski runs are responsible for obtaining information about blasting from slope management. Please note: During and after fresh snow falls there will be avalanche blasting in the area – risk of avalanches! Avoid areas with avalanche risk at these times! Information at the base stations. Skiing accidents: In the case of an accident, please report the accident with exact details using the emergency call point, nearest lift station or designated call point. For the telephone numbers for the ski run rescue service for the respective area, refer to the information blocks. The ski run rescue service is

chargeable. Ski run preparation: The use of slope maintenance machines, also while the ski runs are in operation, cannot be avoided. Please be sure to keep a safe distance from these machines. Do not cross below slope maintenance vehicles on steep slopes as these may accidentally slip down. Where the view is restricted, in narrow passages or on car tracks, take extra care as slope maintenance vehicles may come the other way. Fresh snow: The Arlberg lifts and cable cars are well known for their efforts to offer perfect ski run conditions every day. However, when fresh snow falls it is unfortunately not always possible to prepare all runs at the same time, even with maximum deployment of slope maintenance equipment. Furthermore, in certain weather conditions fresh snow will not attach itself to the older snow covering below and will slip, forming heaps and bumps in spite of the preparation work. This cannot be prevented, even with the best ski run management.

For safe enjoyment in our ski area please follow the valid FIS regulations for skiers and snowboarders and above all be careful and considerate. The complete FIS regulations are available at many lift access points and at www.skiarberg.at
